SPP's reaction to the Pensions Dashboards Programme's call for input on staging dates was picked up by <u>Pensions Expert</u>, <u>Pensions Age</u>, and <u>Money Marketing</u>, quoting Paul McGlone (Aon, Immediate Past SPP President).

The importance of value for members in any consideration of DC consolidation was explored in <u>Pensions Expert</u> by Tim Box (Lane Clark & Peacock LLP & Chair of SPP's DC Committee).

Long-Term Assets Funds are explored in <u>Pensions Expert</u>, with Natalie Winterfrost (Law Debenture Pension Trustees & SPP's Investment Committee) addressing concerns over illiquid assets.
