### SPP IN THE NEWS

Dashboard – the clarity still required to meet expected deadlines is explored by SPP President, James Riley in <u>Professional Pensions</u> (register for free).

Single Code consultation – concerns raised across the industry over process and timescale for this very substantial consultation were set out in <u>Pensions expert</u> by Mark Bondi (Capita Pension Solutions Limited, Chair SPP's Legislation Committee).

DC matters, including member flexibility, engagement and digital technology were featured in <u>Pensions Age</u>, with thanks to James Riley and the DC event speakers for this thinking.

The question of raising the normal minimum pension age was explored by Nick White, (Travers Smith & SPP's Legislation Committee) in our regular <u>View from the SPP</u> column in **Pensions Age** (P.18).

On the Government's new anti-scam measures, <u>Pensions Expert</u> features Stuart Reid (Hymans Robertson, Chair of SPP's Administration Committee).

### **COMMITTEE & CONSULTATION NEWS**

#### The following consultation responses and calls for evidence have now been submitted:

- We have <u>responded</u> to UK Parliament's Work and Pensions Committee on their <u>call of evidence</u> regarding Accessing pension savings. Our thanks to Robin Nimmo (Royal London) and Paul McBride.
- TPR's mammoth <u>consultation</u> on the new Code of Practice was <u>responded to</u>. Our thanks to all contributing authors and in particular, Mark Bondi (Capita Pension Solutions Limited), for his Herculean efforts.
- The FCA's <u>consultation</u> on a new UK prudential regime for MiFID investment firms prompted these <u>comments</u> from SPP. Our thanks to Neil Davies (Barnett Waddingham).

#### Other key matters under review include:

- HMRC's <u>consultation</u> on Raising standards in the tax advice market with the Society working
  across the industry on the potential consequences of the widening of the definition of tax advice.
- The Pensions Dashboard Programme's <u>call for input</u> on its staging recommendations.
- DWP's <u>consultation</u> on pension scams: empowering trustees and protecting members.

- DWP's <u>consultation</u> into Consideration of social risks and opportunities by occupational pension schemes.
- PPF's consultation on asset information from DB schemes.
- DWP's <u>consultation</u> on Simpler annual benefit statements.
- FCA's <u>consultation</u> on the Pensions Consumer Journey.
- IFoA's <u>consultation</u> into Practising Certificates Scheme Proposals.
- The Department for Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy's <u>consultation</u> into restoring trust in audit and corporate governance.
- DWP's consultation into permitted charges in DC.
