The SPP has written several papers over the Summer:

• Inclusive Futures: An SPP Paper on Social Mobility

An insight into social mobility in the pensions and wider business world featuring Sarah Atkinson, Chief Executive of the Social Mobility Foundation and SPP member Ian McQuade, Chief Executive of Muse Advisory.

• Inclusive Futures: An SPP Paper on Neurodiversity

This paper shines a light on neurodiversity in the pensions industry, detailing the thoughts of both Lynn Wassell, Chief Executive of national neurodiversity charity, The Donaldson Trust and SPP member Niraj Shah, Investment Analyst at LCP.

SPP Paper: Less Friction, Better Transfers - Creating a More Agile Risk Transfer Process

This informational paper examines what more can be done to increase efficiency and effectiveness in the risk transfer process.

• SPP Paper: Power in Principle? Balancing Mandation and Market Confidence

This paper, written in response to proposals in the Pension Schemes Bill to introduce government power to dictate a minimum level of pension scheme investment in UK productive assets, highlights ambiguity with the legislation as it is currently written and the potential for unintended consequences.

• SPP Paper: Saving Retirement - Who is at Risk and Why?

This paper examines what the recently revived Pensions Commission should consider on the issue of adequacy and why, including the definition of 'adequate', identifying the under pensioned and exploring how disenfranchised groups could be better supported.
